Mayor Maloof called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm. The prayer was offered by Alderman Sargent. The pledge to our Nations's Flag was led by Mayor Maloof. The City Recorder called the roll and all were present except Alderman Wilson. Alderman Sargent moved to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing of May 19, 2025. Alderman Fletcher seconded the motion and it passed 4/0. Alderman Fletcher moved to approve the minutes of the City Council meeting of May 19, 2025. Alderman Lay seconded the motion and it passed 4/0.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Maloof reported that the Memorial Day event went well also the first Responders event at the park was a success. The July 4th parade will start at 10pm. The top for the sidewalk lights was installed and tested. The next monthly meeting will be July 28, 2025.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief William Raline gave his report. He stated that no firearm is allowed in city hall for safety purposes. Please be mindful that animals and children should not be left in hot cars. They have written around 14 citations to the truck drivers for parking in no parking zones. Alderman Fletcher asked why the department would need overtime. Mayor Maloof stated there will be a workshop to discuss overtime. Alderman lay asked about the homeless camp and the traffic at Pilot. The chief is working on these situations.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chief Travis Lawyer gave his report. They had a problem with tires having to be replaced on the trucks because of an accident on the interstate.

CODES AND BUILDING INSPECTIONS

There is an issue on Boswell Ct. with a fence. There is an issue with trash on Dixie Lee Diner property. He is checking all food trucks for proper city license and renewals. There were 6 building inspections and 4 permits issues. June 12th was the deadline for Mountain Inn, however they have submitted to the BZA so we will see the outcome of this meeting. Alderman Lay asked if property owners get notified from the chief.

UTILITY DEPARTMENT

There was no report. Mayor Maloof will look into fluoride being put in the water at the water plant. There was a question on overtime and the lake level.

PLANNING COMMISSION

Mr. Rusty Leonard explained a situation at the Christ Church with an RV being parked there for a person to help Rev. Millsaps. The council will look into this with the codes enforcer.

There is a BZA meeting at 3:30 and regular Planning Commission meeting at 4:00 on July 1, 2025.

BEAUTIFICATION & TREE BOARD

Ms. Martha Ann Pilcher reported that the committee is working on a grant for the parks in town from T-Mobile. They are also working on what to do in the greenway.

IMAGINE MONTEAGLE

Alderman Fletcher gave an overview of Imagine Monteagle. They are working on different projects and the Monteagle School Sign was the first of many projects.

ALDERMAN

Alderman Fletcher discussed the I & I Project, flows and how Phrase I helped the system. He would like to discuss the swap of the ballpark property. He would like to know who pays occupancy tax to the state for Airbnb's.

Alderman Lay would like to know what grants are available to the city. We need to have a grant writer. We need to be able to service all customers. He discussed affordable housing. He asked about fire hydrants and the fire department is working on this. There are loose rocks at the bridge by the dump. Mayor Maloof will check into this. He discussed a flag pole being donated, the TDOT Bridge and holiday pay for employees.

	The stairs on the west end facing the highway have been altered. The support brace has been removed and no temporary brace has been placed to help support the structural load. This inspection addresses only the items in the complaint and any fire/safety deficiencies in plain view. This inspection report does not constitute an approval of the entire structure including items or installations not visible or listed in the complaint.

Notes:

6-24-25 Did a site visit and there is construction occurring on the stairwell. They have the plans on site, footers for the supports are poured and bolted in. Some of the iron work has been done(See Attachments), which will require a third party inspection. Rain has been an issue.

5-20-25 Site visit conducted and no construction has began stairs are still in disrepair.

4-3-25 Site visit was conducted by myself, Robert Merchant, and Patrick Linstruth for a follow-up on the agreed upon March 31st date to start construction. Met with Mr. Patel, who informed me that the contractor was currently in the process of a prefab of the stairs off site. I asked Mr. Patel to have the contractor contact me via e-mail, phone call or text message. Contractor never contacted me, but sent a text to Mr. Patel, who forwarded me the text, there was no valuable information in the text that could solidify any work is being done, or the ability for me to ascertain if this is an actual licensed contractor.

2-12-25 Made an on site visit and talked to the lady at the desk, who said she would have Mr. Patel contact me. Mr. Patel contacted Jeremy Tipton, and then I contacted Mr. Patel where we discussed his troubles with finding a contractor. He has sent myself and supervisor Tipton the email correspondence between himself and the contractors. We will be issuing a POCA (Plan of Corrective Action) with a dedicated start date of no more than 45 days in regards to item 5. If you have any questions or concerns

- 1-7-25 Did an on-site visit and talked to both Mr. Patel and Mrs. Patel, they informed me two subs had submitted bids, and that they were awaiting for three other subs to submit bids before granting the contract. The two who did submit bids had expressed doubts that work would be able to start until April or May.
- 12-19-20 Went to do an update and found no construction has occurred. I talked to Mr. Patel while there.
- 11-26-24 I received approved plans for this project and made an updated report. With the submission of plans deficiency 9 has been removed.
- 10-17-24 Did a search on file-net and saw a letter for 90 day no-response, just following up with Mr. Patel about the conversation we had on October 4th in regards to a new engineer on the project, however, he was not there and I left a message for him to contact me.
- 9-6-24 I took this project over on 5-24 and talked with Mr. Clayton. Plans were submitted shortly after our conversation, and I was using the pre-approval inspection report as the complaint paper as well. I have talked to Mr. Clayton, who had submitted plans to our office, and he has told me that he anticipates an update from the structural engineer on Monday, Sept 9th.
- 3-6-2024 A meeting took place on site between Mr. Patel and myself. Mr. Patel had requested the meeting to get clarification on a few items. We discussed the scope of what needed to be corrected. Mr. Patel was advised that since he was replacing the stairs, the guards and handrails associated with those two sets of stairs would need to be brought into compliance with the 2012 IBC.
- 2-29-2024 A follow-up inspection was conducted on this date. Director Bainbridge issued a letter on 12-14-2023 advising that the deficiencies were to be corrected by this date. No further work has been done, and the noted deficiencies remain. The owner stated that he is working with an architect to submit plans for the stair replacement. Mr. Patel has been in communication with Director Bainbridge and Supervisor Hunt regarding the railings.
- 12-8-23 Inspector Jay Merchant did a follow-up inspection and found that some work had been done; the end support beam has been removed and no temporary support has been added. This needs to be done until the work can be completed. It appears that Mr. Patel is using wood to repair instead of the current steel and concrete material, therefore, deficiency 9 has been added.
- 11-3-2023 Regional Supervisor Jeff Hunt and I conducted a follow-up inspection on this date, and we spoke with Mr. Patel. He stated that all the material to replace the stairs in now on site, and that work will begin on Tuesday, November 7th. Mr. Patel was advised that the stairs and railings must be built to code. Mr. Patel stated that he submitted construction documentation to the Town of Monteagle for approval and has a permit for the work. I asked Mr. Patel to send us the construction documentation that he submitted to Monteagle, but nothing has been received as of 11/6. The Monteagle building official stated that nothing has been received from Mr. Patel regarding the stair replacement.
- 10-2-2023 Inspector Cheyenne Stone-Anderson and I conducted a follow-up inspection on this date, and the stairs and railings still have not been repaired/replaced.
- 07-25-2023 Follow up inspection conducted by Inspectors Jason McGee and Jeff Gammon. The staircase in question has still not been repaired. This poses an immediate hazard to the public and should be repaired immediately.
- 04-20-23 Follow up inspection conducted with fellow inspector, Jay Merchant. I have been informed by Mr. Patel that the fire extinguisher cabinet has not yet come in yet to be installed, but that it should be in by the end of the day today. Please let me know once it has come in and installed. Thank you.
- 04-17-23 Follow up inspection conducted. The fore extinguisher is on site, but the exterior cabinet is not yet installed. I have been informed that the cabinet is set to be delivered and installed by Wednesday April 19th. The stair repairs are on track to be completed by the end of the month. I plan to return Thursday April 20th. Please let me know if you have any questions and/or concerns. Thank you.
- 04-04-23 Follow up inspection and retrieval of revised POCA conducted. The POCA has been sent to the Mid-East Supervisor, Jeff Hunt for further approval. The smoke alarms are all in place and have been tested. The laundry room is also now easily accessible and more orderly. The fire extinguisher box and extinguisher are to be in place by April 15th per revised POCA. The stairs are also set to be corrected by April 30th per revised POCA. Please let me know if you have any questions and/or concerns. I can be reached at Desaree. Frost@tn.gov or (615) 948-9521. Thank you.

03-15-23 Follow up inspection conducted. The remainder of the open noted deficiencies still remain and have not been corrected at this time. A new POCA will be due Monday March 20, 2023 by end of business day. I have been informed by Mr. Patel that these deficiencies should be corrected by March 29, 2023 and were unable to be completed prior to today due to severe storms that went through the Monteagle area. Please let me know if you have any questions and/or concerns. Thank you.

02-07-23 Follow up inspection conducted. The Plan of Corrective Action was approved February 6, 2023. A copy of the letter from the Tennessee licensed architect will be attached to this report stating that the concrete ceiling fire separation has not been altered in anyway. The smoke detectors are currently in the process of being replaced and hardwired throughout the facility. The exit signs are now properly mounted in all necessary areas. The fire extinguisher in the laundry room in now unobstructed. The stairs and handrails will be sandblasted and repaired by March 15, 2023. The storage in the laundry room is also in to process of being moved into another area. The ceiling tiles in the lobby have now been replaced and the fire extinguisher on the second level is in the process of being recharged. Please let me know once these are complete in order to conduct follow up inspection. Please let me know if you have any questions and/or concerns. Thank you.

01-09-23 Complaint inspection conducted with Lead Fire and Building Code Inspector, Jeff Gammon and Electrical Inspector, Neal Fisher. This is a 76 unit two story hotel/motel. Upon inspection there appeared to be a portion of the roof missing on the second floor where the mechanical and storage rooms are located, thus making the attic space open to the elements. Plans will need to be submitted to the plans review section by a Tennessee licensed design professional. During inspection it was noted that a smoke detector was missing from room 130 and the smoke detectors located in rooms 119 and 221 do not appear to be in proper working condition. The exterior handrails and stairs that have excessive rust deterioration appear to be falling located in the upstairs area appear to need repair and unable to bear any weight on them. There were also exit signs on the 2nd level that did not appear to be properly mounted or in proper working condition when tested. The fire extinguisher located in the laundry room appeared to be blocked and the extinguisher near room 216 appeared to be missing from the cabinet. The storage in the laundry room also need to be in an orderly manner. 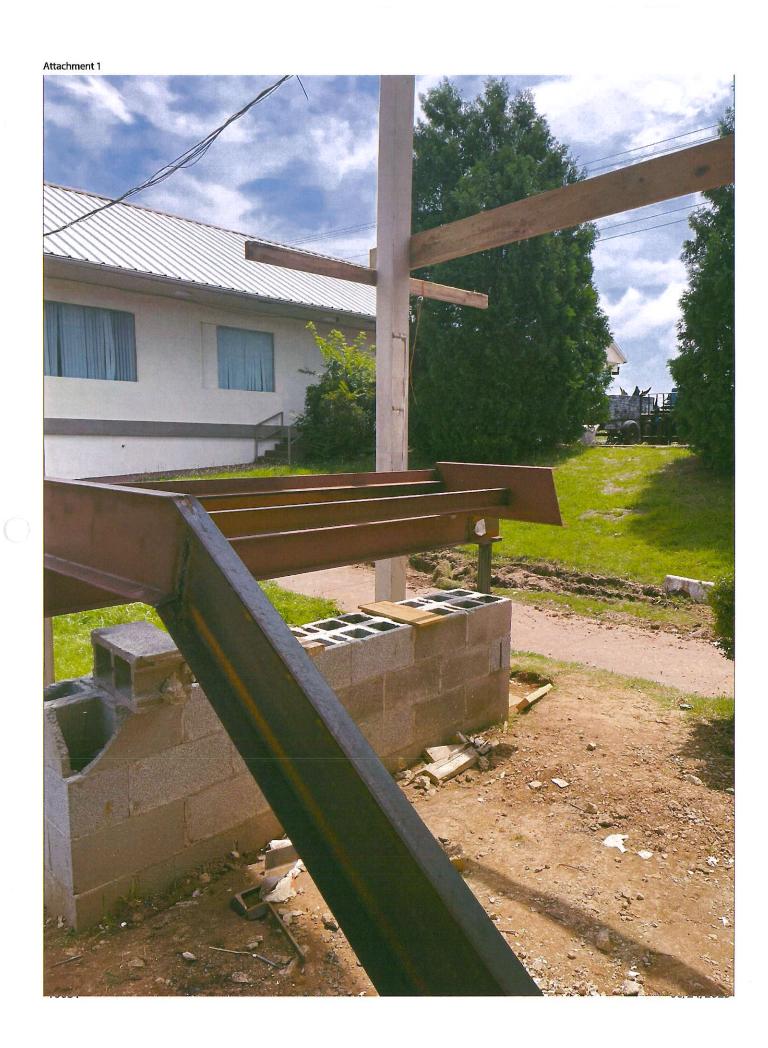

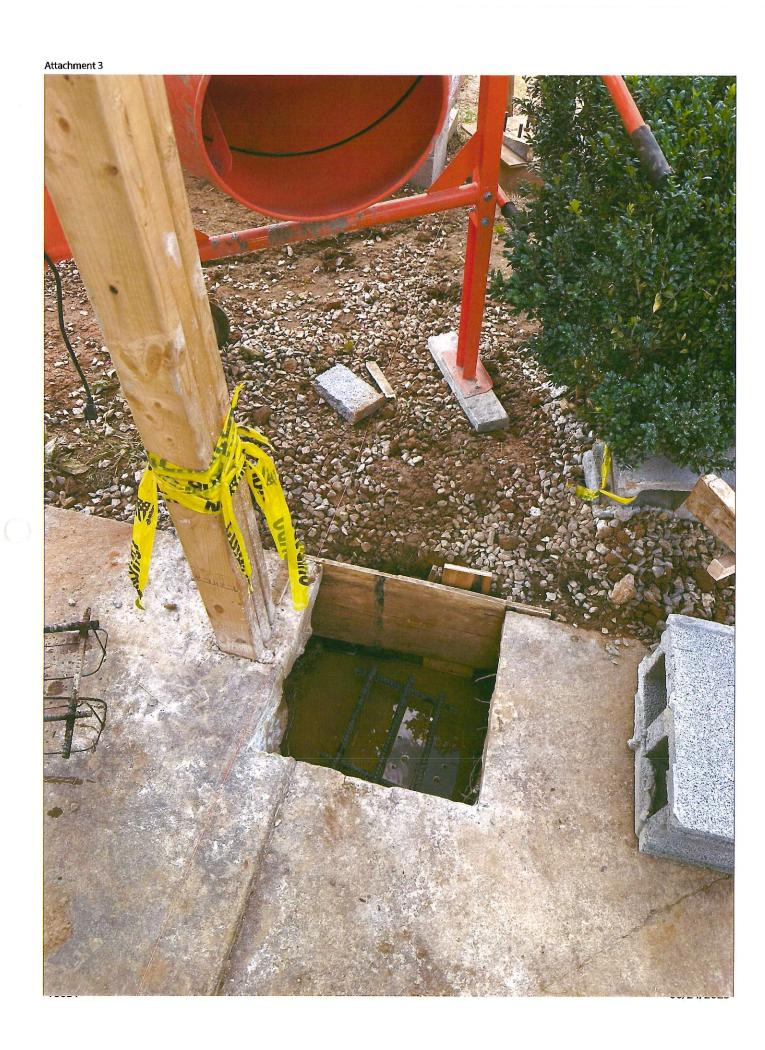
