Mayor Maloof called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm. The prayer was offered by Mr. Polk Van Zandt. The pledge to our nations flag was offered by Mayor Maloof. The city recorder called the roll and all were present. Alderman Fletcher moved to approve the minutes of the February 24<sup>th</sup> Public Hearing and the City Council minutes. Alderman Sargent seconded the motion and it passed 5/0.

# **MAYOR'S COMMUNICATIONS**

Mayor Maloof reported that the Fresh Mess will be June through October. The Easter Egg hunt will be April 12, 2025 at Hannah Pickett Park at 11:00 am. The new website is up and running. The next Planning Commission meeting will be April 1, 2025 at 4:00 pm. The next City Council meeting will be April 28, 2025 at 5:00 pm. Phase I of the I & I project is almost finished, Phase II will follow. The case with RBT is under review.

# **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

Chief William Raline gave his report. He advised citizens to please turn on their lights during the fog. Officer Kateron was recognized for helping a girl from out of state that was being assaulted. With the help of our department the man will go to jail for a very long time.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chief Travis Lawyer gave his report. They are starting the Emergency Medical Responder Class. They will be working with the Grundy EMS. They are working on getting a hydrant repair tool. He thanked Mr. Dewight Layne for letting them train at his business. The CDBG equipment is starting to come in.

## **BUILDING INSPECTIONS**

There were six inspections and one certificate of occupancy. There were eight permits issued.

# **CODES**

Super 8 appeared in City Court and will be back in court on May 22, 2025. The deadline for the burned Mountain Inn is June 12, 2025. They are working on the sign enforcement and they will check out the homeless living behind the Super 8.

## **PARKS & RECREATION**

Mr. Ty Burnette reported that there will be practice at the ball field two nights a week and when they have a game the Fire Department will run the concession stand. The lights at the field need to be repaired and the mayor is working on this.

## UTILITY DEPARTMENT

Mr. John Condra discussed his sewer report on flows and I & I problems. Alderman Lay asked if the project is helping the problems we are having with the flow and if Phase II will help. We need flow meters to monitor the flow. We only have 300 sewer customers and it takes a few days to get the results of the flow at the sewer plant.

# STREET DEPARTMENT

Mr. Keith Butner stated that the culverts are being cleaned out as best they can because of all the rain. The street repair is finished by the contractor doing the I & I project.

# **BEAUTIFICATION/TREE ADVISIORY COUNCIL**

Ms. Martha Ann Pilcher reported there will be an Arbor Day Ceremony on Thursday April 3, 2025 at 2:00 pm. The Art group is planning a painting day to paint the trash cans in town. Mr. Dan Pate a local landscaper who will be working on the tringle by the Post Office. He will be donating his time and plants as well as the city funding some of the project.

# **IMAGINE MONTEAGLE**

Alderman Wilson reported that there will be a workshop on April 1, 2025 at 2:30 to discuss zoning. The public is invited to attend. There will be sub committees to work on grants for new businesses, fund raising and the next phases of Imagine Monteagle. They will be meeting on Water & Sewer over the next 10 months.

# **ALDERMAN**

Alderman Lay asked about the siren at 911. It is not working properly and they are looking to see if it is worth repairing.

Alderman Lay asked if we can get a map of the utility lines and if TDOT had been contacted about the traffic danger on Wrens Nest Road and Pilot. There was discussion on the Ever bridge system and who was getting emergency calls.

# **OLD BUSINESS**

There was a question if North Bluff Circle has been researched. We will get more information on this street as well as Unaka which Ms. Lucy Keeble stated is a private drive.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

First reading of Ordinance 03-25 an ordinance to add additional requirements for special exceptions. Alderman Sargent moved to approve this Ordinance on first reading. Alderman Wilson seconded the motion and it passed 5/0.

### Fire Department Report:

-22 Emergency Calls to date for the month of March-

- April 4<sup>th</sup> starts our Emergency Medical Responder Class. We have 4 members in the class for Monteagle.
   Upon completion, this will bring the number to 9 total for emergency medical certified members. We also have 2 EMT-A's and 1 EMT-B in the group.
- We are working with Mueller to obtain a hydrant repair tool to allow internal repairs for our damaged hydrants. We will then be able to repair them in-house to reduce budget costs as well as be able to do repairs in a reasonable time.
- Members have been working on pre-plans as well as hydrant maintenance projects. With spring here, we
  will be back out painting hydrants and exercising them as required by NFPA and ISO guidelines.

#### **Codes Enforcement Report:**

- Super 8 has appeared in municipal court and the case has been continued
- 1 residential property has been cited for property maintenance issues.
